Dear Property Owner,

On behalf of the Klamath River Renewal Corporation (Renewal Corporation), I write regarding the need for removal of docks on Copco Reservoir by October 30, 2023. Our records indicate that you currently have such a dock.

On November 17, 2022, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) issued a License Surrender Order for the Lower Klamath Project (FERC no. 14803). FERC authorized the deconstruction of the J.C. Boyle Dam, Copco No. 1 and 2 Dams, Iron Gate Dam, the powerhouses, and related facilities. FERC also authorized habitat restoration within the reservoir footprints and other locations. On December 1, 2022, the Renewal Corporation along with the States of California and Oregon accepted license transfer from PacifiCorp. On that date, the Renewal Corporation became the owner of the Project lands, including those lands underneath Copco Reservoir and docks.

As required in the License Surrender Order, the Renewal Corporation will begin drawdown of Copco Reservoir on or about January 1, 2024. In preparation for that, **all docks on Copco Reservoir must be removed by October 30, 2023**, so as to avoid the significant risks to public safety associated with docks becoming unmoored during drawdown.

If you do not want to retain your dock structure or materials, please contact us and the Renewal Corporation will remove and dispose of your dock without any cost to you. If you would like to keep your dock structure or any of its materials, please remove your dock from the reservoir by October 30, 2023, placing materials above the ordinary high-water mark of the reservoir on your private property. As licensee, the Renewal Corporation will be required to remove and dispose of any docks that remain on Copco Reservoir after October 30, 2023, and there will not be an opportunity for property owners to retrieve the materials.
